READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER



First Reading: Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41

The high priest chastised Peter and the other apostles for continuing to preach when they had been ordered to stop. Peter replied he would rather obey God than men, considering God's power even over death. They are again warned to stop speaking of Jesus, and then freed.

Second Reading: Revelation 5:11-14

John had a vision of many angels and all the living creatures of the world gathered around a throne. The angels cried out that the slain Lamb was worthy of receiving power, glory and praise. Then every creature on earth called out praise to God and the Lamb, and the elders fell down and worshipped.

Gospel: John 21:1-19

Jesus appeared to the disciples for the third time since his resurrection while they were fishing. They hadn't caught anything, and then Jesus advised them to cast their net from the other side of the boat. When they did this, they caught a great number of fish. Jesus then asked Peter three times, "Do you love me?" When Peter said he did, Jesus asked him to tend and feed his sheep.

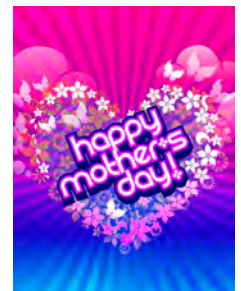

CAP (Child Assault Prevention) Sessions

CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. Attendance is required in order to comply with the USCCB's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The policy of the diocese is that adults will attend CAP once every five years. **CAP 1** teaches attendees to recognize child abuse and neglect and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for new volunteers and employees. **CAP 2** is No More Bullies, No More Victims and is a workshop on bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyberbullying is also addressed. Both sessions are 90 minutes. Adults must attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2. After five years, adults have the option of attending CAP 1 again if they prefer.

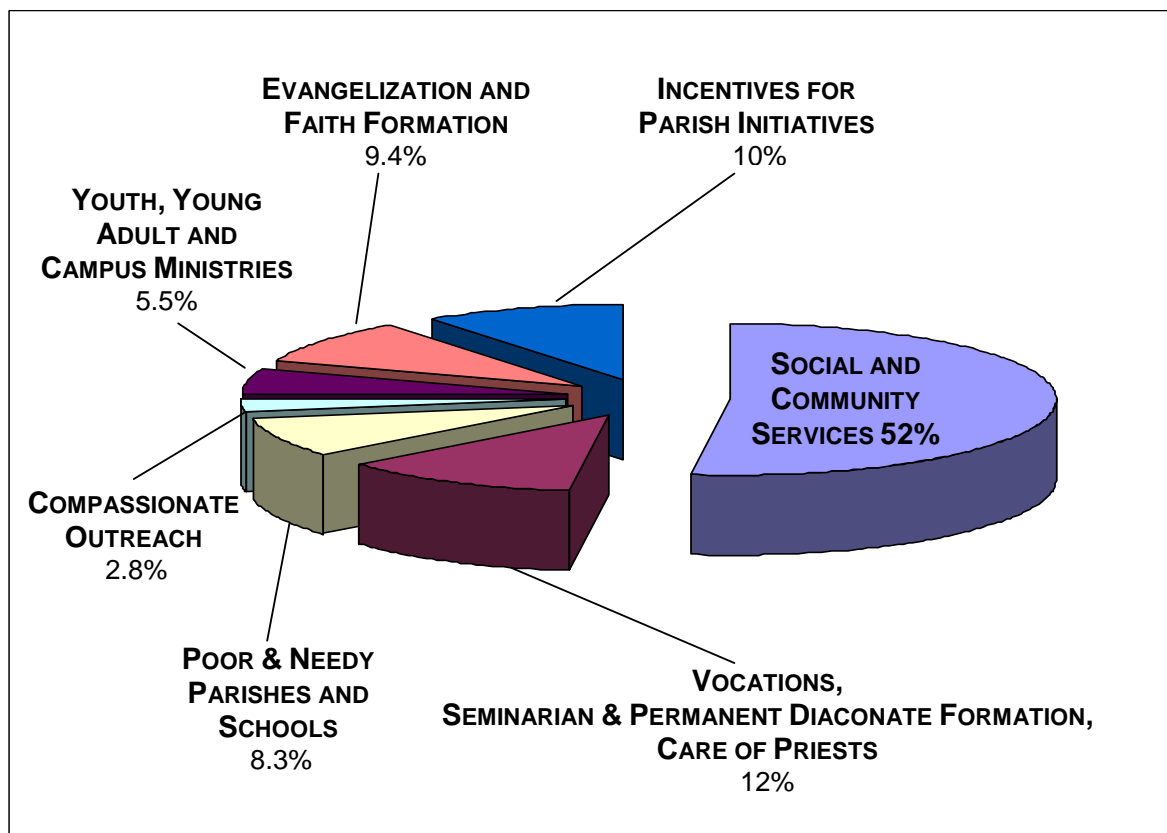

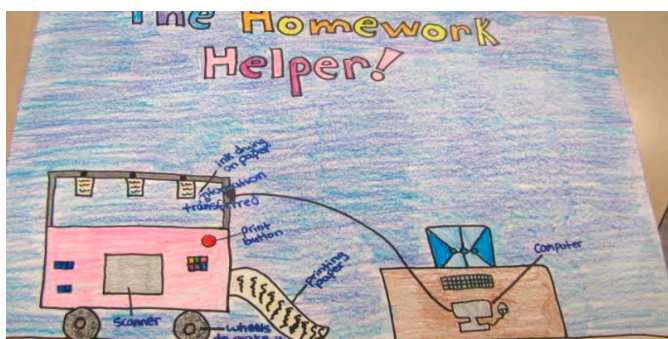

6th, 7th, 8th Grade Science Under the Microscope



6th Grade Science:

Recently the 6th graders learned about the different types of biomes found on Earth. They created charts comparing and contrasting the different types of animal and plant life, yearly rainfall, temperature, and wrote a brief description of each. During a lab period they created a fresh water and grassland biome from a soda bottle. The students cut the top of the bottle off, placed rocks, water, water plant, and a snail in the bottom of the bottle. The top was inverted with a strip of gauze hanging from the lid, filled it with soil and scattered grass seed in the soil, and covered it with plastic wrap to encourage growth. The biome is self sustaining; the grassland does not need watering because of the gauze and the snail will eat the algae that will form on the plant and sides of the bottle. The students really enjoyed making and taking home their biomes. Their parents were very appreciative!



7th Grade Science:

The 7th graders are learning about the different types of machines, from simple to compound. They are currently working on a booklet that compares and contrasts the six types of simple machines. In an ongoing lab the students are designing a compound machine that will make work easier. They must use the six types of simple machines to create their invention. They will then present it to the class in the form of an infomercial. We can't wait to see if any of these inventions will make work easier in our future.

8th Grade Science:

The 8th graders have been learning about the Periodic Table. The students adopted an element and made posters depicting their adoptive element. The poster included the element's name, symbol, atomic mass and number. They also had to write a slogan for that element. Here are some of the slogans: Xenon: "Lighting the path to a brighter tomorrow!" By Antonio Spinosi; Nickel: "We gave our two cents twice and still had money leftover" by Sean DiPietropolo; and Helium: A well known little gas that will lift your balloon, but if we don't take care, it will soon be doomed!" by Isabel Caruso.
