

READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



First Reading: Malachi 3:19-20a

The prophet Malachi warned that the time would come when all the evil people would be punished. He then speaks of the arrival of "the sun of justice, with its healing rays," believed by most to mean Jesus.

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Some of the Thessalonians claimed Christ's return was imminent, so they stopped working and asked others for food. Paul describes his willingness to work, so that he would not impose on others. He encourages them to follow his example and earn their own living.

Gospel: Luke 21:5-19

Jesus warns of the persecution all Christians will face because of him, and how some will even be put to death. Yet he says they will not be harmed because "by patient endurance you will save your lives." If Jesus' followers are loyal, they will be resurrected and their suffering will end.

Dear Father:

Office of the Bishop

Over the past few days one of the most powerful storms ever recorded destroyed entire villages and devastated cities across the Philippines. The numbers of the dead and the millions affected by the storm are staggering. The full extend of the structural damage is still unknown.

As Catholics, we mourn the terrible suffering of those affected by Typhoon Haiyan and we want to assist. I ask you to encourage our people to contribute to a Special Collection this coming weekend. The funds will be used to support the humanitarian efforts of Catholic Relief Services and for the rebuilding of the infrastructure of the parishes, schools, catechetical centers, clinics, etc. in the dioceses impacted by the storm.

Catholic Relief Services has already begun to embark on a major emergency response and will continue to respond with immediate needs for water, food, shelter and medical care and eventually assist in the long term recovery from the disaster. CRS is the official international humanitarian agency of the Catholic Church in the United States. As was done at the time of the earthquake in Haiti, a percentage of the funds collected will also be used to support the long-term need to rebuild the church in those areas of the Philippines that have been affected.

I ask that you express my gratitude to our parishioners who are always ready to respond in whatever way they can to tragedies such as what we are witnessing the Philippines. May God bless them and you.

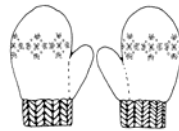
