READINGS

MASSES INTENTIONS



First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses petitions the people to follow the commandments God has set before them. He reminds them that the laws are not in the sky or far away at sea, but are accessible to them and meant to be followed if they wish to prosper.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:15-20

Paul discusses the divine nature of Jesus, and explains that Jesus was created before anything else. Everything else was "created through him, and for him."

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

While discussing everlasting life, a lawyer mentions loving one's neighbor as oneself. The lawyer then asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus tells him about a man beaten by robbers, who was ignored by both a priest and a Levite before a Samaritan stopped and offered him aid. Jesus asks the lawyer who was neighbor to the injured man. The lawyer says "the one who treated him with compassion." Jesus encourages him to go and do the same.

On behalf of the staff of the Special Projects Department at Gloucester County Special Services School District, I would like to extend my deepest appreciation to you and the members of St. Simon Stock Parish. Your recent donations of bathing suits, towels, clothing, toys, food and school and art supplies for the students in our Migrant Education Program were overwhelmingly generous.

The migrant children who are enrolled in our summer programs in the Hammonton and Bridgeton areas move frequently throughout the summer months so that their parents can find work on farms to support their families. Many reside in sub-standard housing or on farm labor camps. Summer Safety tips:

- Old sunscreen may deteriorate becoming less effective or causing skin irritation
- The temperature in a car with closed windows can reach over 120 degrees within 7 minutes of exiting the car. Do not leave, children, pets or the elderly in the car even for a "quick minute"
- Hats and sunglasses provide protection for the ears and scalp (main site for skin cancers)
- Water safety is essential, use life jackets and approved flotation devices
- Check for rip current warnings and only swim when lifeguard is on duty
- Wear helmets when bike riding, waterskiing, and zip lining
- In large crowds with small children, have them wear a distinctive article of clothing to make it easier to keep tract of them. (Neon t shirts, hats or bandanas)

Bringing food to a picnic or cookout:

- Use an insulated cooler filled with ice or frozen gel packs. Frozen food can also be used as a cold source.
- Foods that need to be kept cold include raw meat, poultry, and seafood; deli and luncheon meats or sandwiches; summer salads (tuna, chicken, egg, pasta, or seafood); cut up fruit and vegetables; and perishable dairy products.
- A full cooler will maintain its cold temperature longer than a partially filled one. When using a cooler, keep it out of the direct sun by placing it in the shade or shelter.
- Avoid opening the cooler repeatedly so that your food stays colder longer.

Cooking on the grill:

- Use separate cutting boards and utensils for raw meat and ready-to-eat items like vegetables or bread.
- Keep perishable food cold until it is ready to cook.
- Use a food thermometer to make sure meat and poultry are cooked thoroughly to their safe minimum internal temperatures
- Beef, Pork, Lamb, & Veal (steaks, roasts, and chops): 145 °F with a 3 minute rest time
- Ground meats: 160 °F
- Whole poultry, poultry breasts, & ground poultry: 165 °F
- Always use a fresh, clean plate and tongs for serving cooked food. Never reuse items that touched raw meat or poultry to serve the food once it is cooked.

Serving food outdoors:

- Perishable food should not sit out for more than two hours. In hot weather (above 90 °F), food should NEVER sit out for more than one hour.
- Serve cold food in small portions, and keep the rest in the cooler. After cooking meat and poultry on the grill, keep it hot until served at 140 °F or warmer.
- Keep hot food hot by setting it to the side of the grill rack, not directly over the coals where they could overcook.

REPORT SEXUAL ABUSE
