RELIC OF SAINT SIMON STOCK

Dear Parishioners,



A few months back, a Mr. Joseph Betz presented me with a first class relic of Saint Simon Stock. It had previously belonged to his Uncle, Father Peter Thomas Beck, O. Carm. Father was a Carmelite Priest and while on studies in Rome, he was given a relic of Saint Simon Stock by a brother Carmelite Priest. This was in 1934.

Saint Simon Stock was a Carmelite Priest and in a vision, the Mother of God appeared to him with the Scapular of the Carmelite Order in her hand. This Scapular she gave Simon Stock with the words, "this shall be a privilege for you and for all the Carmelites, that anyone dying in your habit shall be saved".

In Ireland, it was a tradition to be buried with the Scapular and Carmelite Habit.

Mr. Betz also gave to me the Certificate of Authenticity dated in Rome, November 1934, stating the Relic to contain "Ossibus S. Simonis Stock" the bone of Saint Simon Stock.

This Holy Relic will be revered every Wednesday, following the daily Mass. I would like to thank Mr. Betz for the privilege of giving us this sacred relic for the spiritual growth of our Parish. St. Simon Stock/ Our Lady of Mt. Carmel/ St. Edward pray for us.

LOW-GLUTEN COMMUNION HOSTS

As you may know, the Vatican recently issued a letter regarding "On the bread and wine for the Eucharist." The letter urged bishops to safeguard the validity of the bread and wine used for the celebration of Eucharist. This means low-gluten hosts are still approved, and no-gluten hosts are still banned.

Here at St. Simon Stock, we offer low-gluten communion hosts. They are purchased from the **Benedictine Sisters of Perpetual Adoration** in Clyde, Missouri. The Sisters have made Vatican-approved, low-gluten altar breads since 2004. These breads have been tested by independent laboratories and deemed safe for use for most people with **Celiac Sprue Disease**.

As early as the 1990s, the Benedictine Sisters started receiving requests for low-gluten hosts. With support from the Office of Divine Worship of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Benedictine Sisters produced a host compliant with the requirements of **Canon Law** and suitable for thousands of low-gluten customers around the world. These sales began in 2004, and the wafers have been **approved by the USCCB for use in all U.S. dioceses**.

The Benedictine Sisters are the **largest religious producers of altar breads** in the United States, making almost **9 million hosts each month**. The low-gluten breads are produced in a separate facility in order to prevent cross-contamination. The low gluten breads are made from water and wheat starch that has had most of the gluten removed. The hosts may be stored in air tight container for up to 6 months.

In 2004, Dr. Alessio Fasano, director of the Center for Celiac Research at the University of Maryland, maintained that the amount of gluten contained in one of the Benedictine Sisters low-gluten altar breads (tested at <.01%) was so minute a celiac sufferer would have to consume 270 wafers daily in order to reach the danger point. A test done **in 2016** indicated the gluten content was **less than .001%**.

There are some people who are so sensitive to gluten that even the tiniest amount can cause discomfort. The Benedictine Sisters follow the recommendation set forth by the USCCB that those with such a serious gluten sensitivity discuss their condition with their pastor or Eucharistic minister.

If you are in need of a low-gluten host for our daily or weekend masses, please let the priest or deacon know before Mass. The host will be put in a separate pyx (the small, round gold container) and placed on the altar. You may purchase your own pyx if you'd like at any Religious Store, such as Abbott's at www.churchsupplies.com. If you have any questions, please contact SueAnn at sajolmc@comcast.net.

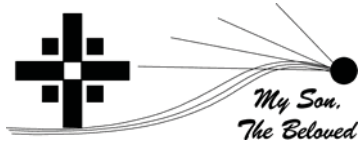

READINGS

READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD



First Reading: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

Daniel depicts God as a judge with many people standing before him. He also describes a man who came to him, and was given power over all other people. This power is described as everlasting and never to be destroyed.

Second Reading: 2 Peter 1:16-19

Peter discusses how the disciples witnessed Jesus being honored and spoken to by God, fulfilling all the prophecies. He also reminds us that these prophecies were God's words, delivered through a person moved by the Holy Spirit.

Gospel: Mt 17:1-9

Jesus took three of his disciples to a high mountain, where Elijah and Moses appeared and spoke to him. Peter suggested they make three tents, one each for Jesus, Moses and Elijah. While he spoke, a voice came from a cloud saying, "This is my Son, the beloved one; listen to him." The disciples became very afraid and fell to their knees. Jesus told them to rise and not to be afraid. As they looked up, they saw only Jesus. As they left the mountain, Jesus warned the disciples not to mention this until he had risen from the dead. Although they did not understand, they obeyed.

WHAT IS DEHYDRATION?

Dehydration occurs when your body loses more fluid than you drink. The most common cause of dehydration is excessive sweating.

RISK FACTORS:

Some people are at a higher risk of developing dehydration than others including

- Workers exposed to excessive heat (e.g, landscapers or those in construction)
- Seniors
- Individuals with chronic illnesses
- Athletes – (especially cyclists and runners)
- Infants and young children
- People residing in high altitudes

SYMPTOMS OF MILD TO MODERATE OF DEHYDRATION:

- sleepiness
- dry mouth
- increased thirst
- decreased urination
- less tear production
- dry skin
- constipation
- dizziness
- lightheadedness
- headache

MEDICAL EMERGENCY:

Seniors and children should be treated immediately even if they are experiencing only mild dehydration

Untreated dehydration can lead to life threatening complications such as:

- heat exhaustion
- heat cramps
- heat stroke
- seizures (due to electrolyte imbalance)
- low blood volume
- kidney failure
- coma

TREATMENT OF DEHYDRATION

Treatments for dehydration include rehydration, either by mouth if able or by intravenous method if necessary, electrolyte replacement and treating diarrhea and vomiting if necessary

For those able to drink, water along with an electrolyte containing drink like Gatorade or other sports drink is best. Pedialyte is recommended for children with dehydration

It is best to avoid hydrating with soda, overly sweet drinks or caffeinated beverages. Also alcohol should be avoided. Each of these can actually worsen dehydration

PREVENTION OF DEHYDRATION

Increase your fluid intake if you are ill especially if you are having diarrhea or vomiting. Call your doctor if you cannot hold down liquids. If you are going to play sports or exercise drink 1-3 cups of water before beginning. Replace your fluids at regular intervals while you are working out. Dress cool in hot months and avoid being out in direct heat if possible. Seek air conditioning or use a fan in hot weather. Be sure to open windows if using a fan.

Remember to drink the recommended amount of fluids even if you are not active!
