To all of the good people and friends of Saint Simon Stock Parish,

As you may have heard, a major campaign is underway at Saint Simon Stock Parish: ***Catholic Strong***, the Campaign for the Catholic Community of South Jersey, is seeking to secure a minimum of \$50 million, which will primarily benefit our local parishes. Seventy percent of the funds raised through this effort (a total of \$35 million) will be allocated for parish needs and thirty percent (a total of \$15 million) will fund the diocese's coordination and support of various ministries. The mission of this campaign is to ensure that our parishes are financially stable and allow the opportunity to address long-term and extraordinary needs so that our Church will have the strength and stability to serve future generations of Catholics.

READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER



First Reading: Acts 4:32-35

This passage describes the actions of the first community of Christians. They were of "one heart and one mind." They had no rich or poor among them, for they shared all necessary items with one another.

Second Reading: I John 5:1-6

John explains that we become God's children by believing in Jesus. When we love God and concern ourselves only with pleasing God, our faith is strong enough to conquer the evil in our world.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

Jesus appeared to the disciples despite locked doors, breathed on them so that they could receive the Holy Spirit, and gave them the power to forgive sins in his name. Thomas, who was not present, refused to believe without seeing Jesus for himself. Jesus appeared again when Thomas was present, and told him, "Blest are they who have not seen and have believed."

St Simon Stock Health Tips

The St Simon Stock Health Care Ministry would like to help assure safe medication use by our parishioners. Join us after the 8 and 9:30 masses on April 15 in the Parish Meeting Center. Bring your medications with you that day so we can review them and answer your questions. We can also help you with updating your medication list. We will be able to check your blood pressure and other vital signs that day if you would like.

Coffee and light refreshments will be served.

We look forward to meeting you on April 15th!

Polypharmacy is the concurrent use of multiple medications by a patient. It is most common in the elderly and can sometimes be more harmful than helpful by creating more risk than benefit. Health professionals consider polypharmacy a situation that requires monitoring and review to validate whether all medications are still necessary.

Specific concerns about polypharmacy include increased risk for adverse drug reactions, drug interactions and cost. Sometimes it can be associated with decreased quality of life including decreased mobility and cognition.

If you are concerned about too many medications talk to your doctor. Never stop your medication on your own. Sometimes a larger number of medications is necessary to manage a patient's condition. However a periodic and thoughtful review of medication by a physician with his patient is reasonable and can be helpful.

The Office of Child and Youth Protection is announcing CAP (Child Assault Prevention) sessions. CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. Attendance is required in order to comply with the USCCB's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The policy of the Diocese of Camden is that adults will attend CAP once every five years.

CAP 1 teaches attendees to **recognize child abuse and neglect** and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for new volunteers and employees.

CAP 2 is called **CAP's Bullying Prevention Program** and is a workshop addressing bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyber-bullying is also presented.

CAP 3 is called **Cyber-Empowerment** and is a workshop which promotes adults understanding of cyber activity of youth while teaching them realistic ways to help children keep their own rights and guard the rights of others in the cyber-sphere.

Each presentation is 90 minutes.

Adults who are new employees or volunteers should attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2 or CAP 3. After five years, adults have the option of attending CAP 1, 2 or 3 when they renew their CAP.
