
PASTORAL/ SACRAMENTAL ANNOUNCEMENTS

As you may have heard, a major campaign is underway at Saint Simon Stock Parish: *Catholic Strong*, the Campaign for the Catholic Community of South Jersey, is seeking to secure a minimum of \$50 million, which will primarily benefit our local parishes. Seventy percent of the funds

raised through this effort (a total of \$35 million) will be allocated for parish needs and thirty percent (a total of \$15 million) will fund the diocese's coordination and support of various ministries. The mission of this campaign is to ensure that our parishes are financially stable and allow the opportunity to address long-term and extraordinary needs so that our Church will have the strength and stability to sere future generations of Catholics.

Catholic Strong is a campaign that owes much of its theme to Pope Francis' call on all of us to become Missionary Disciples. This concept he first broached in his 2013 Apostolic Exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium (The Joy of the Gospel)*.

"The Joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus. Those who accept His offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness. With Christ joy is constantly born anew. From there he tasked us to do more, to welcome more, to embrace more by becoming missionary disciples. ""I dream of a 'missionary option,' that is, a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything, so that the Church's customs, ways of doing things, times and schedules, language and structures can be suitably channeled for the evangelization of today's world rather than for her self-preservation."

The Catholic Strong campaign, has at its core an emphasis on evangelization, to bring back those Catholics who have fallen away and to inspire non-Catholics to join us in a faith that is enthusiastic and joyful.

Through your support, we will create in both our parishes and the diocese new programs and initiatives to evangelize to all who wish to find a home in our South Jersey Catholic community.

John describes Jesus' first visit to the disciples after his resurrection. He gave them the Holy Spirit and the power to forgive other people or hold them responsible for their actions.





CAP SESSIONS FOR JUNE

The Office of Child and Youth Protection is announcing CAP (Child Assault Prevention) sessions. CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. Attendance is required in order to comply with the USCCB's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The policy of the Diocese of

Protection of Children and Young People. The policy of the Di Camden is that adults will attend CAP once every five years.

<u>CAP 1</u> teaches attendees to recognize child abuse and neglect and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for new volunteers and employees. <u>CAP 2</u> is called <u>CAP's Bullying Prevention Program</u> and is a workshop addressing bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyber-bullying is also presented. <u>CAP 3</u> is called <u>Cyber-Empowerment</u> and is a workshop which promotes adults understanding of cyber activity of youth while teaching them realistic ways to help children keep their own rights and guard the rights of others in the cyber-sphere. Each presentation is 90 minutes. Adults who are new employees or volunteers should attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2 or CAP 3. After five years, adults have the option of attending CAP 1, 2 or 3 when they renew their CAP.

THE CHRIST DEATH AND RESURRECTION ART WORK IN THE SANCTUARY (WALL BEHIND ALTAR)

Through the centuries our Catholic tradition has witnessed innumerable manifestations of art in the worship space. It is the agreement of variety that brings testimony to the infinite possibilities of art in the church community. The wall behind the altar in our church is a testament of this.

In creating this design, the artist wanted to connect faith of the community to symbols of faith. To accomplish this parishioners were asked to supply tiles or glass, which was meaningful to them, from their homes. For example, glass dessert dishes and kitchen tiles were supplied. The artist then broke these items and incorporated them into the symbols created. Our symbols are plentiful. Our designs are meaningful. They are universal signs and symbols of our faith......

As a symbol of unity & perfection, the **circle** signifies the infinite with no beginning or end. The **square**, with its worldly connotations, symbolizes the temporal aspects of earthly existence. The equilateral **triangle** symbolizes the Trinity through the three equal parts joined in completion. The **cross**, which is left as a channel absent of physical form, represents the removal of death with the resurrected Christ. The **cross** within a circle, known as the cruciform nimbus, refers to our redemption through the cross and the Risen Christ. The **spiral** functions as: an armature both visually and physically, leading us into and out of the composition; a symbol of extension of the ongoing, never-ending act of creation; illumination of the twelve symbols of the apostles of Jesus Christ who go forth continually spreading the Word and work of salvation.

The symbols are:

- 1. St. Peter -rock and keys
- 2. St. James the Elder –scallop shell
- 3. St. Jude Thaddeus -raft and sail
- 4. St. Andrew -diagonal cross
- 5. St. Matthew coin purse
- 6. St. Bartholomew -knife

- 7. St. Philip -crucible
- 8. St. James the Younger -club
- 9. St. Thomas -carpenter's rule
- 10. St. Simon fish and hook
- 11. St. Paul sword and book
- 12. St. John chalice and serpent

Central to this design is the figure of the **Resurrected Christ** superimposed on the empty space of the cross behind him. He is surrounded by representations of the Holy Trinity, Agnes Dei, the Lamb of Revelation, the Four Evangelists and the Holy Family.

Holy Trinity Panel: depicts the hand of God emerging from a cloud in the act of creation and benediction separating order for chaos, dividing light from darkness, "When the dazzling light of my presence passes by, I will put you in an opening in the rock and cover you with my hand until I have passed by" (Exodus 33:22.)

Agnus Dei (the Lamb) Panel: as creation is our entry into Scripture, Revelation is our re-entry into the new paradise with the second Adam, the Lamb of Revelation, "Then I looked and there was the Lamb standing on Mt. Zion." (Rev. 14:1) The Lamb is harbored by a rainbow that extends from the hand of God, a reference to the rainbow after the Great Flood; it signifies the new peace. In Revelation John writes, "His face gleamed like precious stone of jasper and carnelian, and all around the throne was a rainbow the color of an emerald." The four rivers that flow from the Lamb are the four rivers of paradise: the Gihon, Tigris, Pishon, and Euphrates. They flow from a single rock just as the four gospels flow from the single rock of Christ.

Four Evangelists Panel: the four evangelists are depicted from the vision of Ezekiel in the Old Testament: "At the center of the storm I saw what looked like four living creatures in human form. Two wings of each were spread out so that the creatures formed a square with their wing tips touching. When they moved, they moved as a group without turning their bodies. Each living creature had four different faces: a human face in front, a lion's face at the right, a bull's face at the left and an eagles' face at the back" (1:5-6, 9-10.)

Holy Family Panel: emerges as a tableau depicting both the human and divine nature of Christ. As an infant his is being fed and nurtured physically by his devoted parents. He in turn feeds and nurtures us, his invited children, to his supper of Eucharist; hence, the angel bearing grain and the costal wound of Christ creating the vine from his blood.

The combined signs and symbols form a lexicon of our heritage in the faith of the now, the hope of the future. They are overwhelming because the message is overwhelming.
