Dear St. Simon Stock Family:

Over the past several months you have heard many things about "CATHOLIC STRONG", The Campaign for the Church in South Jersey and St. Simon Stock Parish. I continue to ask, not just for your monetary pledge and support, but your prayers as we embark on the next phase of this all important campaign.

As explained 70% of the funds pledged come to St. Simon Stock Parish. These funds will be used for several projects. The most important are a new HVAC system for the church and the Parish Life Center. The current church HVAC system is 25 years old and showing its fatigue. As I stated, we will be repurposing the old church into the "**Parish Life Center**".

I am very grateful to our parish leadership who has taken on this challenge and responded so generously to Catholic Strong. This gratefulness extends to those families who have responded to my requests. Their sacrifice has been unmatched! Thank you! Thank you!

So a little history. The last diocesan capital campaign occurred in 1994. That was just after the completion of our church and many of you were still satisfying the pledge you made to build the church, convent and numerous rehab projects on this campus. Catholic Strong is so different then most campaigns of this nature. Having been a pastor for many years and having full knowledge what the stress for funds for capital improvement does to a parish, Bishop Sullivan took a pastoral approach. 70% of what is pledged goes to St. Simon Stock. The other funds will go to fund several new programs in the diocese: one of which I spoke about personally to Bishop Sullivan. He is committed to doing something about the opioid epidemic.

Our plan for the future.

As we have stated in the case document and presented to all of you at all Masses last weekend, the Parish Life Center will be the hub of all major activities at St. Simon Stock. We have created a plan to accommodate the ministries currently using the Parish Meeting Center as well as creating a new, light filled, vibrant space in the nave of the old church. This very unique design will bring back the grandeur of the old church's exposed wood trusses. We will also retain the beautiful stained glass on the Pike side, including the wonderful rose window. After that it is all about meeting space for the 20 plus ministries who use the PMC currently, a fellowship hall, a place for large group events, a place for luncheons after funerals, space for our Youth Ministry program and most importantly space for our new Seniors Ministry and our "Wellness" programs under the auspices of Nursing Ministry. Plans for the Parish Life Center can be found on the walls of the church. Please

stop by after Mass and review them. It is exciting as we plan for the future generation of parishioners of St. Simon Stock Parish.

We hope to start our seniors program next fall. No need to wait until new space is built and ready to open. I want to kick this off and minister to our seniors. They so much deserve this.

Our Advanced Giving Phase has brought some handsome results. I am so grateful to all of you who have pledged. Father Goyette and I also pledged over \$6000 each. This is a major sacrifice for the both of us as I know it is for many of you. So thank you to all of you who made their pledged!



May St. Simon Stock bless us with abundant gifts though the intercession of Our Lady of Mount Carmel!









The Future St. Simon Stock **PARISH LIFE CENTER**

Parish Life Center-Floor 2





READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



First Reading: Genesis 3:9-15

God asked Adam why he ate the fruit from the forbidden tree. Adam blames his companion, who in turn blames a serpent. God then told the serpent it would be banned from other animals, and be an enemy of humanity.

Second Reading: II Corinthians 4:13-5:1

Paul describes our belief that "He who raised up the Lord Jesus will raise us up along with Jesus." Although our bodies grow weaker, each day our inner strength grows. Paul also describes our burdens as light when compared to the eternal rewards we can attain.

Gospel: Mark 3:20-35

Some of the scribes felt that Jesus was possessed and claimed that he expelled demons with help from Satan. Jesus silenced them by asking, "How can Satan expel Satan?" Jesus also warned them that although many sins would be forgiven, blasphemy against the Holy Spirit would not. Jesus was then told that his mother, brother and sisters were asking for him. He asked, "Who are my mother and brother and sisters? Whoever does the will of God is brother and sister and mother to me." This demonstrates Jesus' deep love for all those who love God.


