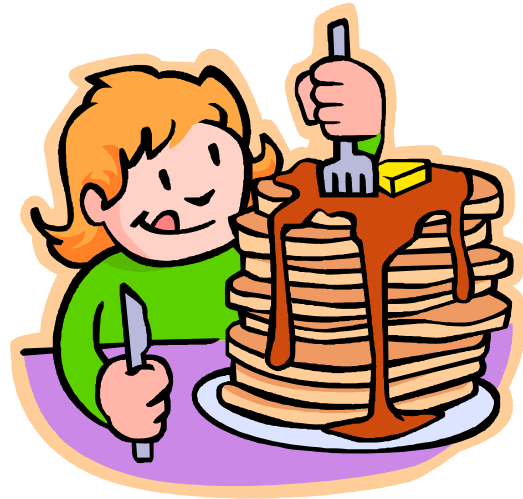

CAP (Child Assault Prevention) Sessions

CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. Attendance is required in order to comply with the USCCB's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The policy of the diocese is that adults will attend CAP once every five years. **CAP 1** teaches attendees to recognize child abuse and neglect and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for new volunteers and employees. **CAP 2** is No More Bullies, No More Victims and is a workshop on bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyberbullying is also addressed. Both sessions are 90 minutes. Adults must attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2. After five years, adults have the option of attending CAP 1 again if they prefer. **The following sessions will be offered in April and May: CAP Phase 1:** Thurs, May 2, 7pm, St. Mary of Mt. Carmel, Hammonton, St. Anthony Hall, Rt. 206; Mon, May 13, 7pm, Christ the Redeemer, Atco, Hall; Wed, May 29, 7 pm, Mary, Queen of All Saints, Pennsauken, School Hall, 49th Street. **CAP Phase 2 – Bullying Prevention** NO CAP PHASE 2. HOUSE OF CHARITY

BISHOP'S ANNUAL APPEAL

The House of Charity Bishop's Annual Appeal is now underway. **To date we have received \$ 50,995.00 (or 54%) on our new incentive goal of \$ 94,538.21 from 167 families, for an average gift of \$ 305.36.** Our parish will receive 25% of any funds collected above that amount. Catholic Home Missions Appeal

Many dioceses right here in the United States do not have enough priests and trained lay ministers to serve their parishes. These dioceses are known as *home missions*. Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Regional School Noteworthy News:

Music is alive and well at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel School. As has been the case for over fifty years, OLMC students are given a well-rounded education, which includes classes in music and opportunities to perform in several different ensembles.

Every week, students from pre-school through eighth grade attend general music class. Young students are given a chance to sing and move to music. Students in the middle grades learn about the various families of musical instruments and different styles of music. Junior high students study periods of music history and how music relates to society and culture.



Students in grades three through eight are given the chance to perform in several musical ensembles. Third graders are introduced to note reading and basic music theory through the study of the recorder, an ancestor of the flute. The school choir draws its members from third through eighth grades. Choir members sing at our monthly school liturgies and perform at two concerts per year.



Our school band is comprised of students from fourth through eighth grades, with the current ensemble boasting sixty members. Students may opt to study flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, xylophone, drums, bass, and piano. Yearly, the band plays at a “Come Join the Band” assembly in September, and is featured in the annual Christmas and Spring Concerts. More advanced members of the band participate in the Camden County Teen Arts Festival and All South Jersey Honor Bands.

OLMC’s instrumental program is rounded out by its three handbell ensembles. The handbells are the newest component of our music department, and have quickly become one of the most popular groups. The bells play music from all periods, in all styles, from classical to folk to gospel.



Perhaps the best way to understand the abundance of talent we have at OLMC is to attend one of our concerts ... so mark your calendars now! Our Spring Concert is scheduled for Friday, May 10 at 7:00 PM, and will feature performances by all of the school’s ensembles.
