A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly
June 16, 2013

“When his host, the Pharisee, saw this, he said to himself, ‘If this man were a prophet, he would know who and what sort of woman this is that touches him – that she is a sinner.’ In answer to his thoughts, Jesus said to him, ‘Simon, I have something to propose to you.’... ‘Teacher’ he said, ‘Speak.’... ‘you gave me no kiss... you did not anoint my head...’ ‘I tell you that is why her many sins are forgiven – because of her great love. Little is forgiven the one whose love is small.”

I begin my reflection asking ‘how great is my love?’ Do I think it is equal to God’s love for me? Do I want to let it overflow in my love for others? How can I apply this teaching to myself? At times I am the host Pharisee, making judgments. At times I am the woman, aware of my need for forgiveness and not fearing to express it reaching out for forgiveness.

How interesting that Jesus addressed His host by reacting to his thoughts. It was not a word which provoked Jesus’ response, but it provided the framework for His teaching.

Remember the game played with children when you asked ‘How big is the baby?’ And with arms extended the answer was given ‘this big.’ The love of Jesus for us has no limits, and there is more to come when I too extend my arms and allow Him to touch me. How do I extend my arms?

When I express my love for the Lord in my service to others, the hungry, the poor, the incarcerated, the immigrant, then I am extending my arms to the Lord. I greet Jesus in them, I anoint them and make them special in my life, I discover the face and heart of Jesus in them. Others admired another woman for doing this. A native of Albania she is better known as Blessed Teresa of Calcutta.

**READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY
ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**



First Reading: 2 Samuel 12:7-10, 13

Because God was displeased with the actions of David concerning Uriah's death in order to marry Bathsheba, God sent Nathan to reprimand David. Nathan reminds David that God anointed him King of Israel and victor over Saul. David realizes his sin against God, but Nathan continues to reveal to David that the child to be born to him shall die.

Second Reading: Galatians 2:16, 19-21

Paul writes of the struggles between Gentiles and Jews who both now profess belief in Christ Jesus. Paul proclaims his life in Christ, working towards unity and faith in the Son of God.

Gospel: Luke 7:36—8:3

While Jesus was dining at the home of a Pharisee, a woman of the city who was a sinner, came and anointed his feet with oil. Weeping, her tears fell upon Jesus' feet and she dried them with her hair. Because of the woman's respect and love, Jesus forgives her sins. This causes those present at the table to question who he is.

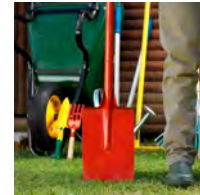

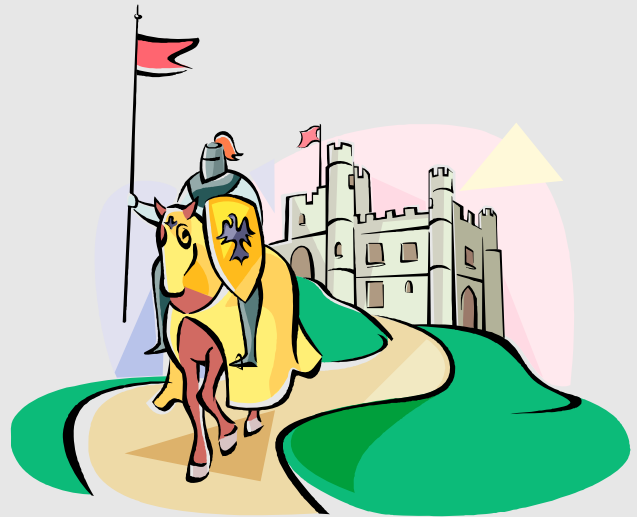

Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Regional School Fifth Grade Happenings

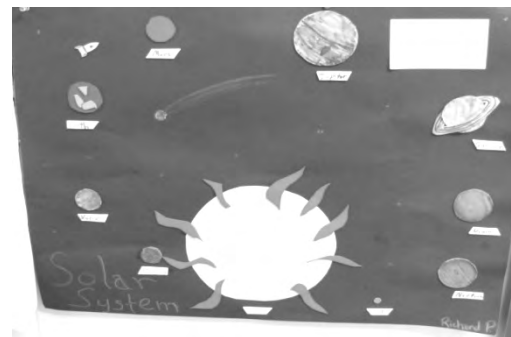

We also prepared for the yearly field trip to Adventure Aquarium by studying sharks as well as other underwater life. But, most recently we explored outer space as students created posters that model our solar system.



During Computer class, all students mastered the use of Power Point when creating brochures for their own zoo, featuring exotic animals from a variety of countries around the world. In Math, weeks were spent working with fractions. We closed the year with a unit on geometry.

Although we worked hard all year, we enjoyed a very special day watching a fun movie and enjoying huge amounts of candy. Why did we take time from our studies? Simply because fifth grade won the candy contest by donating the most candy to this year's fashion show!
