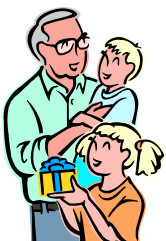

HOUSE OF CHARITY UPDATE

Our goal for this year's House of Charity is \$87, 324.37. Last year we collected a very generous amount from our parishioners, \$84, 523. To date we have received donations totaling \$ 78,010 (89% of goal). Thank you to all who have contributed.

As an incentive, if we go over our goal, 87,324.37, we will get 25% of all monies collected between the money collected last year, \$84,523 and our goal. AND, if we exceed our goal, then we also will receive an additional 25% of all monies collected over our goal.

Right now we are approximately \$10,000 short of making our goal. If you have not contributed yet, there is still time to do so. You can make an outright contribution, or you can make a pledge and pay it with as many as 10 payments. The House of Charity will bill you. You can also make a credit card payment or a debit payment.

Pledge cards are in the back of the Church. Please consider donating to the House of Charity/Bishop's Annual Appeal. Your donation will not only help the House of Charity make their goal, but will also help your parish make our goal.

Our theme for 2014, "Unearthing the Treasure" vividly captures the challenge our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has put before us all. Focusing on the Holy Father's vision will lead us on a path of holiness and service.

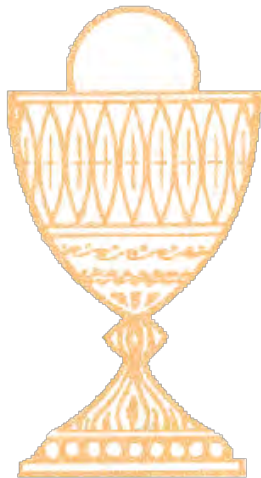
