MISSION CO-OP APPEAL

Our Mission Co-op Collection will be taken up this weekend for the Diocese of Gonaives in Haiti, home to more than one million of the poorest people on earth. Diocesan missionaries work among the poor Catholics in Haiti, at clinics that offer primary health care to mothers and infants, hospices for the dying, Catholic elementary schools and feeding programs.

Joining us this weekend to speak on behalf of the Diocese of Gonaives will be Doug Campbell, Executive Director of Hands Together, an organization inspired by Fr. Tom Hagan, OSFS. The following is an excerpt from the Hands Together website, written by Mr. Campbell:

"In 1986 a handful of students from Lafayette College returned home from a Haiti trip led by Fr. Tom Hagan, OSFS, our Catholic Chaplain. I was one of those students and I never could have guessed that the experience would impact my life so profoundly. Fr. Tom Hagan helped me, and many other young people at Lafayette, see more clearly our responsibility to serve others. He taught us that true joy and real satisfaction come when one gives of himself. Fr. Tom encouraged me and many of my fellow students to "strive to see Jesus in every human face." These simple teachings were the beginning of what would become Hands Together.

Hands Together is first a fellowship of people working to build a better world, and second, a program of interconnected outreach activities designed to help the poorest of the poor. The ministry of Hands Together is best described by Bishop Ken Untener who wrote

We plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise. We lay foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces effects far beyond our capabilities. **We cannot do everything, and there is liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something and to do it very well.** It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest. We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers, not master builders; ministers not messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own.

We recognize that the results of our work are ultimately in God's hands. This dependence upon God has transformed this small student-based group into a program helping thousands of families in the poorest areas of Haiti. Please continue to pray for us that we may continue to hear the cry of the poor and, through God's grace, help those are suffering.

We hope that members of Hands Together work passionately to build a more compassionate and human world; that Hands Together's workers will be known for their tenderness and mercy, especially toward the poor; that people will visit our projects and experience the beauty and goodness of the people they encounter; that our volunteers will assess the needs of their own communities with a renewed sense of compassion, and search for ways to respond respectfully to help others; that the families who live in Haiti's desert villages will be healthy, that the people in the slums of Port-au-Prince will drink clean water; that everyone in Haiti will have access to education; that in the poorest communities, Hands Together helps people use their resources so that they become free and live dignified lives; and we hope that the people of Haiti will be able to build a strong community with their friends from Hands Together and exchange ideas in order to improve their quality of life".

CAP SESSIONS FOR SEPTEMBER

The Office of Child and Youth Protection is announcing CAP (Child Assault Prevention) sessions. CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. Attendance is required in order to comply with the USCCB's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The policy of the Diocese of Camden is that adults will attend CAP once every five years. **CAP 1** teaches attendees to recognize child abuse and neglect and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for new volunteers and employees. **CAP 2** is called *No More Bullies, No More Victims* and is a workshop addressing bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyber-bullying is also presented. **CAP 3** is called *Cyber-Empowerment* and is a workshop which promotes adults understanding of cyber activity of youth while teaching them realistic ways to help children keep their own rights and guard the rights of others in the cyber-sphere. Each presentation is 90 minutes. Adults who are new employees or volunteers should attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2 or CAP 3. After five years, adults have the option of attending CAP 1 or 2 again if they prefer. The following sessions will be offered in **September**:

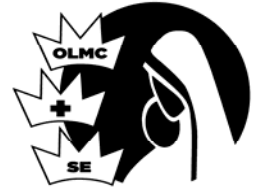

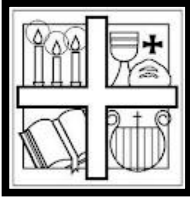
