40 Days of Francis: Day 6



Pope Francis quote of the week: I would like to ask you all to see a ray of hope as well in the eyes and hearts of refugees and of those who have been forcibly displaced.... I admire the courage of those who hope to be able gradually to resume a normal life, waiting for joy and love to return to brighten their existence. We can and must all nourish this hope!"

Knot of the week: Each year more than 100 refugees leave violence and persecution in their home countries and build new lives in the Diocese of Camden.

With just one week left until the arrival of Pope Francis in Philadelphia this weekend, we are almost finished our 40 Day period of preparation. We remember immigrants and especially refugees this week, who flee violence and must start anew in the Diocese of Camden. This week also begins the World Meeting of Families congress in Philadelphia. Thousands of families from around the world, and several from our parishes and Diocese, will attend this historic gathering of faith. We'll be following the six families sponsored by Catholic Charities to attend the gathering on our website at CatholicCharitiesCamden.org/40Days.

READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



First Reading: Wisdom 2:12, 17-20

Wicked people discuss their anger at the just one, because they do not like being reproached for their evil ways. They want to see if he is the Son of God, so they decide to torture him and see if God will come to defend him. They decide to condemn him to a shameful death and see if the claims are true that God will take care of him.

Second Reading: James 3:16—4:3

James discusses the importance of avoiding jealousy and strife. People should strive for peace and justice instead of concentrating on material pleasures which can tempt people to sin to obtain whatever they desire.

Gospel: Mark 9:30-37

Jesus again attempts to prepare his disciples for his death and resurrection, although they do not yet fully understand. They had been arguing over who was the most important one, but Jesus tells them whoever wants to rank first must be willing to remain a servant to all. He also tells them that anyone who welcomes a child in his name welcomes both him and God.

DIOCESE OF CAMDEN - Office of Child & Youth Protection CAP (Child Assault Prevention) Sessions

CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. The policy of the Diocese of Camden is that adults will attend CAP once every five years. **CAP 1** teaches attendees to recognize child abuse and neglect and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for new volunteers and employees. **CAP 2** is called *No More Bullies, No More Victims* and is a workshop addressing bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyber-bullying is also presented. **CAP 3** is called *Cyber-Empowerment* and is a workshop which promotes adults understanding of cyber activity of youth while teaching them realistic ways to help children keep their own rights and guard the rights of others in the cyber-sphere. Each presentation is 90 minutes. Adults who are new employees or volunteers should attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2 or CAP 3. After five years, adults have the option of attending CAP 1, 2 or 3 when they renew their CAP. The following sessions will be offered in **September 2015:**

Dear Parish Nurse:

I hope this letter finds you well. I am asking for your help in the development of a very important new outreach program for our parish.

As a vibrant faith community, we have grown by helping each other in our faith journey over the years through service ministries such as the St. Vincent DePaul Society, Knights of Columbus, Youth Ministry, Adult Faith Formation, Social Justice and Visiting the Sick and Homebound. In addition, our Hospitality and Liturgical Ministries have also made invaluable contributions to St. Simon Stock Parish.

All of these ministries have one thing in common: parishioners who are willing to prayerfully consider sharing their gifts for the benefit of fellow parishioners. That is why I'm writing to you today. Our lay leadership, with support from the diocese, has been asked to explore the development of a parish nursing ministry.

In our diocese, the practice of parish nursing is guided by the American Nurses' Association (ANA) Faith Community Nursing Scope and Standards of Practice (2005). Roles that a parish nurse assumes within a parish are influenced by the needs of the community and the expertise of the parish nurse[s]. Such a ministry would serve our own parish in a number of ways. Some of the roles that are based on the ANA Guidelines are health counselor, health educator, referral agent, advocate, integrator of faith and health, and coordinator of volunteer services.

I am not asking you to volunteer at this time; only to come to an informational meeting which will be held on Tuesday, September 29th at 7:30 PM in the Parish Meeting Center so that you can help us assess if a ministry is needed in our parish. If there is enough support from nurses like you, then we will determine how to move forward together.
