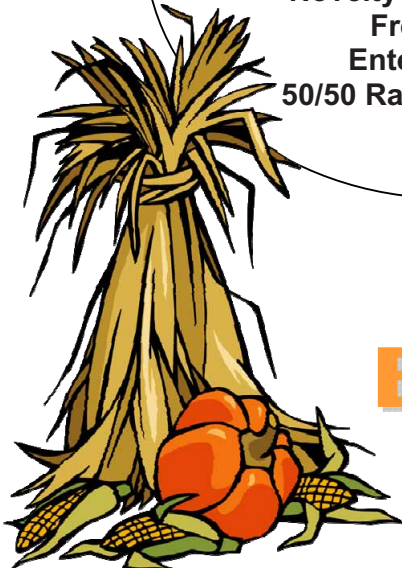

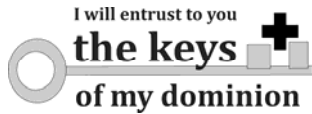

READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



First Reading: Isaiah 22:19-23

This passage refers to the use of authority and indicates the Key as the symbol of authority. The words "open" and "shut" refer to the power that will eventually be given to Peter.

Second Reading: Romans 11:33-36

Paul writes ecstatic and praise-filled words about God's plan for his people. In him, he writes, "all things are."

Gospel: Matthew 16:13-20

When Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter exclaims, "You are the Messiah!" Christ then declares that Peter is the "Rock" upon which he will build his Church, promising him the power "to bind" and "to loose."

Bishop Sullivan's Statement Regarding Charlottesville

The horrific images from the deadly white supremacist rally in Charlottesville, Virginia on Saturday, August 12th are seared in the minds and hearts of good people. They are a tragic reminder that racism is alive in our country and must be defeated. White supremacy, neo-Nazism and racism are evil. They have no place in our country or in our Church.

Despite the great progress in racial justice we have seen in the past 50 years, the sin of racism continues to infect our social structures and some individual hearts. We see evidence of this fact in gut-wrenching displays like the rally in Charlottesville. Racism can be overt and dramatic or subtle and quiet. It is immoral in every form. The Church teaches that it is a sin.

I encourage Catholics in the Diocese of Camden to pray and act. All of us are called to leave the sidelines and get involved. Catholics have a crucial role to play in the fight for racial justice, inspired by our belief that every single person is sacred because each person is created in the image and likeness of God. Let us pray for an end to racism, hatred, and violence and work to promote respect and unity among all Americans.

Harvest Fest CHINESE AUCTION

St. Simon Stock Conference of St. Vincent de Paul Society – FYI

"In New Jersey, one third or 330,000 households spend at least half of their income on rent, according to 2014 Census data. The fair market rent for a two-bedroom apartment in NJ is \$1379 according to the National Low Income Housing Coalition, based in Washington, D. C. To afford that level of rent, plus utilities, requires an annual household income of \$55,152. That's equivalent to a job paying \$26.52 an hour. Yet the average N. J. renter earns less than \$17 an hour. That gap, \$9.54 per hour, is the third-widest margin in the U.S., behind Hawaii and Maryland." Excerpts from the Courier Post 1/8/17 article on shortage of affordable housing.

SVdP provides emergency (usually partial) financial assistance to community members within our parish boundary who have housing eviction or utility shut off notices after a due diligence meeting or home visit as our membership time and resources allow. People in need are primarily assisted with food which allows that money to be used towards other bills. Most local renters pay substantially less such as \$712 per month.

CAP SESSIONS FOR SEPTEMBER

The Office of Child and Youth Protection is announcing CAP (Child Assault Prevention) sessions. CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. Attendance is required in order to comply with the USCCB's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The policy of the Diocese of Camden is that adults will attend CAP once every five years.

CAP 1 teaches attendees to **recognize child abuse and neglect** and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for new volunteers and employees.

CAP 2 is called **CAP's Bullying Prevention Program** and is a workshop addressing bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyber-bullying is also presented.

CAP 3 is called **Cyber-Empowerment** and is a workshop which promotes adults understanding of cyber activity of youth while teaching them realistic ways to help children keep their own rights and guard the rights of others in the cyber-sphere. Each presentation is 90 minutes.

Adults who are new employees or volunteers should attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2 or CAP 3. After five years, adults have the option of attending CAP 1, 2 or 3 when they renew their CAP.
