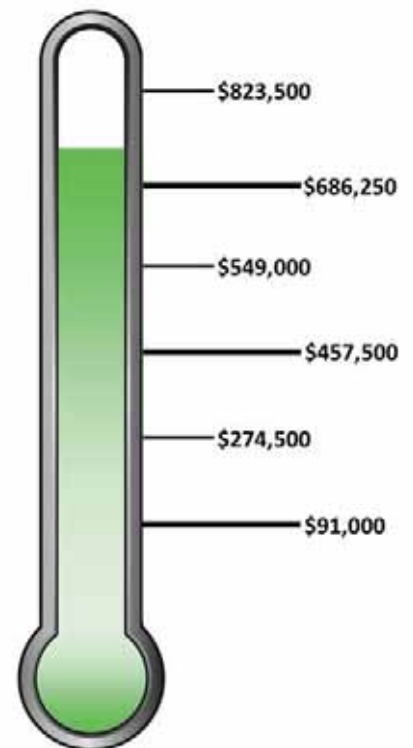

READINGS

MASS INTENTIONS

READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



First Reading: Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15

The Israelites complain that Moses led them to the desert and there is no food for them there. Then the Lord told Moses he would rain down bread from heaven so the people might know that I, the Lord, am your God. God did as he had promised and in the morning the people found the bread that he had given them.

Second Reading: Ephesians 4:17, 20-24

Paul tells the Ephesians that they must give up their old way of life and live in accordance with the truth that Christ has brought them. He reminds them to acquire a spiritual way of thinking, and to remember that they are made in God's image and act accordingly.

Gospel: John 6:24-35

The people Jesus had fed on five loaves of bread follow him, and Jesus tells them they should not be looking for perishable food, but for spiritual food. The people want a sign that they should believe in him. He explains that he is the bread of life, and anyone who believes will not experience hunger or thirst. The people did not fully understand that he was speaking in the spiritual sense, and not of actual food.

HEAT RELATED ILLNESS- WHAT SHOULD YOU KNOW

Did you know that heat is the number one weather related killer in the United States? Statistical data from the National Weather Service shows that heat causes more fatalities per year than floods, lightning, tornadoes and hurricanes combined!

Heat Exhaustion - If your body is becoming overheated, you may experience exhaustion. Symptoms may include:

- ✓ Heavy sweating
- ✓ Muscle cramps
- ✓ Tiredness
- ✓ Weakness
- ✓ Dizziness or fainting
- ✓ Headache
- ✓ Nausea or vomiting

Stop activity and seek a cool place (shade or air-conditioning) and drink water or a sports drink.

Heat Cramps - If your body is dehydrated you may experience heat cramps. Symptoms include:

- ✓ muscle pains or spasms usually in the legs, abdomen or arms
- ✓ Staying out of the heat and drinking water are key

Heat Stroke

Heat stroke is the most serious heat related illness. It occurs when the body becomes unable to control its temperature. The body temperature rises rapidly and the body is unable to cool down. Body temperature can rise to 106 or higher in 10-15 minutes. Heat stroke can cause death or permanent disability if emergency treatment is not provided. Warning signs vary but may include the following:

- ✓ Extremely high body temp, (> 104 degrees)
- ✓ Red, hot and dry or moist skin
- ✓ Rapid, strong pulse
- ✓ Palpitations
- ✓ Dizziness, nausea, confusion
- ✓ Unconsciousness
- ✓ Seek medical attention immediately and begin cooling if heat stroke is suspected!!
